They may worry about being judged or teased by pears. On top of these emotional hurdles, many students are behind academically due to the instability and trauma they've experienced, making it hard to keep up with their studies.

With recent changes in the school district and loss of funding, we no longer have an on-site Families In Transition (FIT) liaison at The Meadowlark. This role was crucial in helping our families with school enrollment, transportation, and other essential services. Without this support, getting ready for school this year may be a bit more challenging.

We are dedicated to helping these children and their families through this transition. Our advocates work closely with families to ensure their kids are enrolled in school and have access to laptops and quiet spaces for homework. This August, we are excited to be hosting a back to school barbeque for Meadowlark guests and past participants, at which we'll be building a community of support, and, thanks to the generous contributions from our community, we'll be providing school supplies, from backpacks to notebooks. Together, we can ensure that every child, no matter their circumstances, has the chance to succeed and feel proud and confident as they start the new school year.

Program Updates

A Family's Story to Recovery and Housing

Kayla and James (names have been changed) entered the Family Housing Center (FHC) at The Meadowlark in December after spending four months at the Johnson Street shelter, following recent felony charges. At six months pregnant and newly sober, Kayla and James were determined to change their lives. They enrolled in a 24-hour per week intensive outpatient treatment program, successfully completed it, and later became mentors for newcomers. James secured employment at the Johnson Street shelter, working overtime to save money as they prepared for their baby's arrival. Meanwhile, Kayla diligently worked with the YWCA housing case manager, staying on top of housing applications.

During their time at FHC, the family achieved several milestones: they opened their first bank account, purchased a car, regained custody of their 2-year-old daughter, and closed their Child and Family Services case with full agency support. The family moved out of The Meadowlark and into a local apartment, paying three months' rent upfront. With the help of the case manager, they furnished their new home. The staff at FHC recognized their dedication, positivity, and love

for their children.

The family expressed immense gratitude to the FHC for the support they received and pride in overcoming their past, achieving sobriety, and finding stability. They now enjoy a fulfilling life surrounded by supportive family members. **Learn more about our housing programs**.

Trailblazer Spotlight: Lonnie Johnson

Born on October 6, 1949, Lonnie Johnson is an aerospace engineer who not only made significant contributions to NASA but also changed the world of toys forever. In 1995, while working on a heat pump he accidentally discovered that the tube he was using shot out a powerful stream of water, sparking a new idea. This unexpected twist led to the creation of the Super Soaker, a water toy that became an instant sensation. Johnson's invention has earned him millions, and today he holds over 100 patents, making him one of the most celebrated African American inventors.

In honor of Johnson's innovative spirit, the YWCA Youth Advocates will lead a fun water rocket activity with the kids during our back-to-school BBQ at the end of the month. *It's sure to be a blast!*
