As we step into the new year, I'm filled with gratitude for this community, the YWCA Team, and the possibilities that lie ahead. At YWCA Missoula, we are embarking on 2025 with a renewed focus on our mission and core values. We are building a strategic plan to ensure we remain responsive to the evolving needs of those we serve. Our Strategic Planning Design Committee is currently deep in the data-collection phase, gathering insights to shape our priorities and the future of our organization.
